Third Grade News

Our Third Grade students will soon be learning about the many different ecosystems and biomes of the world. We will especially focus on the rainforest ecosystem and learn the many ways and reasons that it is so important to us. The students will integrate all subject areas while studying this science unit.

We were all very excited to learn that our school board approved a very special field trip for the third grade students to visit the Lied Jungle at the Henry Doorly Zoo in Omaha on May 25th. We will have the opportunity to visit a desert, ocean, and jungle ecosystem and observe the different forms of habitat that live there.



comMUSICation is a program with a vision to communicate the importance of music programs in a child's life and to connect kids to a brighter and more successful musical future.

Musical programs have been proven to:

- **Reverse stress** at the molecular level. (*University School of Medicine and Applied Bio-systems*)

- **Reduce** job burnout, improve moods, and increase the human growth hormone. (*Advances in Mind-body Medicine and the University of Miami medical studies program*)



- Help middle school and high school students who participate in instrumental music **score significantly higher on standardized tests** including achievements in math, science, and language arts. (*University of Sarasota Study*)

- Help students **score 100% higher on fractions tests** than those who are not involved in music programs. (*Neurological Research foundation*)

- Help students **score higher on SATs** in both verbal and math. (*Neurological Research foundation*)

A survey aimed at gauging the interest in music programs was distributed to 254 of the local 4th & 5th grade students. The results showed:

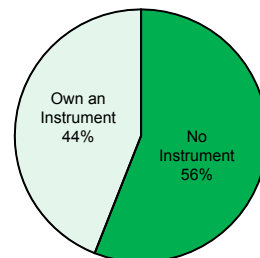
- **75%** said that music makes them **feel happy**.

- **66%** want to **play an instrument**.

- **87%** said school music programs were **important to them**.

- **40%** feel that music programs help them **get better grades**.

- **56%** of students who want to play an instrument said they **did not own an instrument** and did not have someone in their family that owned an instrument.

The **demand and need** for musical instruments heavily **outweigh the supply** of the Storm Lake elementary, middle and high school music programs.

Junior/Senior Prom *unforgettable Nights!*

The date for this year's Junior-Senior Prom is **Saturday April, 16 2011**. It will be held in Siebens Forum at Buena Vista University.

The Juniors have chosen an official Prom photographer. Information about picture packages will be available in the office closer to the date. The theme for the 2011 Junior-Senior Prom is "Unforgettable Nights".

Those eligible to attend the banquet and the dance are juniors and seniors from Storm Lake High School. Any dates from outside the school must have at least junior classification. Students of sophomore classification or below are NOT eligible to attend either of these events.

If a SLHS Junior or Senior plan to bring a date that is not enrolled at SLHS or a person beyond high school, he/she must complete a registration form for an outside guest and pay \$15.00. The registration forms and payment must be taken care of in the high school office by March 31st.

SLHS Juniors wanting to attend the dinner and dance must pay \$30. Juniors only wanting to attend the dance must pay \$15. Seniors that did not pay their Juniors dues last year and want to attend the dinner and dance must pay \$30. Seniors that did not pay Junior dues last year and only want to attend the dance must pay \$15. Seniors who paid their Junior dues last year only need to pay for the dinner (\$15).

Although this is a formal type of event, formal wear is not required for attending either the dinner or the dance. The school is aware of the high cost of purchasing or renting formal wear, so we wish to emphasize that such wear is not required.

As you can see, plans are underway for making the Junior-Senior Prom 2011 a memorable event for all.
